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RISK MANAGEMENT CORNER: ROAD SAFETY FOR FLAGGERS

Cal-OSHA Construction Safety Order Article 11, § 1599 states in part: a flagger or flaggers shall be utilized at locations on a construction site where barricades and warning signs cannot control the moving traffic. Unless this section provides differently, the number of flaggers required and matters regarding the deployment of the flagger or flaggers shall be according to the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, January 13, 2012, published by the State Department of Transportation.

Employers, supervisors, flaggers, and crew members can all ensure the safety of flaggers and other road construction workers by complying with Workplace Safety and Cal-OSHA Regulations.

Employers are required to take all necessary precautions to ensure the safety, health, and welfare of workers.

Employers must:

- Ensure flaggers are trained by the organization. Compliance safety training must be provided by a provider with the qualifications and the experience necessary to effectively instruct the employee and must be documented as required by 8 CCR 3203, "Injury Illness and Prevention Program."
- Ensure all workers and supervisors are aware of hazards in the workplace.
- Ensure workers and supervisors are trained in, and follow, safe work procedures and necessary precautions.
- Provide an effective means of communication with other flaggers when visibility is obstructed.
- Provide workers with competent supervision.
- Set up and remove road signage.
- Provide and ensure flaggers use all required Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), including:
 - ANSI/ISEA 107-2004 or equivalent subsequent revisions, Class 3 Level 2, high-visibility apparel in fluorescent yellow-green or orange red;
 - Protective headwear in a fluorescent color (equipped with retro- reflective tape during hours of darkness);
 - STOP/SLOW paddle with reflective surfaces;
 - Cal-OSHA approved footwear; and
 - Flashlight fitted with red signaling wand when working during hours of darkness.

Workers are required to attend safety and flagger training and follow the safety and health rules and safe work procedures of the workplace.

Workers must:

- Care for and use required safety equipment, clothing, and devices properly.
- Be alert and aware of their surroundings.
- Avoid use of personal electronic devices, including cell phones and other music or media players, while working.
- Use an effective means of communicating with other flaggers when visibility is poor or obstructed.
